





RECOMMENDATIONS

Regent/Mayor shall be able to guarantee the accountability of the high quality service at all public and private health facilities in the region, through good clinical governance, especially: prioritizing an organized team work, monitoring of maternal and newborn service performance regularly, implementing studies on maternal mortality and nearmiss cases regularly, and monitoring the case fatality rate.

EMAS mentoring approach, with the support from stakeholders at all government levels, is very important to be continued and developedwithin and outside the districts/cities to

attain a wider scope of high-quality intervention

to saving maternal and neonatal.

District/City Health Office could improve the maternal and neonatal emergency service quality at all public and private health facilities in the region, including Independent Practice Midwife.

District/City has to govern an integrated and comprehensive referral system, involving the public and private health facilities in order to improve the effectivity and efficiency of the maternal and neonatal emergency referral.

Provincial/district/city government has to allocate resources to support the availability of communication technology between the reference and the referee facilities in order to expedite communication through real-time monitoring in effective and efficient maternal and neonatal emergency care administration.

The availability of cross-program and crosssectoral Working Groups in each district/city is an essential element to monitor and ensure the accountability of access and high quality maternal and neonatal emergency services network.

At the district/city, civil society and other key organizations shall participate in the Civil Society Forum (FMM), monitoring the accountability of the health facility, health workers, Local Health Office and the local government to ensure the consistent availability of high quality maternal and neonatal health services.

Strengthening health information system at all level is needed in order to improve the capacity to monitor and evaluate the maternal and neonatal health services including the outcome.
